

Rachel Huynh Named 2025 Recipient of the John F. "Jack" Schlegel Leadership Development Award



The Pharmacy Leadership & Education Institute (PLEI) proudly announces Rachel Huynh as the 2025 recipient of the John F. "Jack" Schlegel Leadership Development Award. Established through the generosity of Alpha Psi alumnus Jack Schlegel and his wife, Priscilla, this prestigious award recognizes a Phi Delta Chi collegiate Brother who demonstrates exceptional leadership potential in the pharmacy profession.

The award honors Jack Schlegel's legacy of service, including his leadership as CEO of the American Association of Colleges of Pharmacy (1981–1984) and the American Pharmacists Association (1984–1989). It celebrates student pharmacists who lead by example—often beyond formal titles—through meaningful contributions to their communities and the profession.

Rachel Huynh stood out for her visionary leadership, service, and advocacy. A first-generation Vietnamese-American from Devon, Pennsylvania, Huynh championed equitable healthcare and empowered underserved populations. As a CDC Diabetes Prevention Program coach, she educated at-risk patients on lifestyle interventions. She also led Temple University's Student National Pharmaceutical Association in the 2024 ADA Step Out Walk and served as a Student Ambassador with the IMPACT-Viet-Capacity Program, designing culturally tailored stroke education for Vietnamese communities.

Within Phi Delta Chi's Alpha Omicron Chapter, Huynh served as Worthy Chief Counselor (chapter president) and Northeast Regional Correspondent, promoting leadership and collaboration. She also held vice president roles in the Student Government Association and the Student College of Clinical Pharmacy, earning accolades such as Most Worthy PY4 Brother and the PY4 Alumni Scholarship.


In her personal statement, Huynh outlined a bold 10-year vision: becoming a clinical pharmacist, completing PGY-1 and PGY-2 residencies, mentoring future leaders, leading medical missions in Vietnam, and teaching in a pharmacy school.

"Rachel embodies the spirit of this award through her empathy, resilience, and commitment to uplifting others," said John D. Grabenstein, who chairs PLEI's Board of Directors. "Her leadership in culturally competent care and community advocacy makes her a truly deserving recipient."

Huynh was selected from a competitive pool of nominees submitted by Phi Delta Chi collegiate chapter advisors. She will receive a \$1,000 honorarium in recognition of her outstanding achievements.

Nominations for the 2026 award will open in early spring 2026. Brothers graduating in 2026 will be eligible to apply.

HISTORY CORNER

Pictured above is the <u>Outstanding Alumni Chapter Award</u>, awarded to the year's best alumni chapter based on social activities, professional and scholarship programs, number of national dues-paying Brothers, and other factors. The award is often considered the alumni version of the <u>Thurston Cup</u>.

From 1975 to 1985, plaques were presented annually to those chapters with the highest percentage of their alumni who are dues-paying members of the national fraternity. Chapters were divided into three groups based on the number of living alumni who have been initiated since 1920: Group I (more than 550 living alumni), Group II (350 - 550 living alumni), and Group III (less than 350 living alumni).

With the exceptions of 2003-2006 and 2011-2014, the Outstanding Alumni Chapter Award has been awarded every year since 1985. Delta and Eta have each won the award 7 times, Alpha Sigma and Alpha Psi have each won 6 times, Omicron and Texas have each won twice, and Alpha Theta and Beta Chi have each won once. The Outstanding Alumni Chapter Award has been highly competitive as of late, with six different alumni chapters having won the award in the past eight years.
