Your Peripheral Brain

Summer brings us many things: warm weather, kids out of school, and, for many pharmacy students, IPPE's and APPE's. With all the learning in the preceding semesters, it can feel overwhelming to keep track of everything and apply it in a clinical setting. Below are some tips and tricks for developing an effective peripheral brain that can support your learning through rotations and beyond.

What is your peripheral brain?

Your peripheral brain is your collection of quick references to information for a variety of pharmacy settings.

Paper or digital?

- Paper avoids issues with connectivity, charging, or lag. It's easy to add quick little notes and can be taken anywhere. Printed guidelines can be easily switched out when changes occur, whereas it may be more difficult to make changes if your guidelines are handwritten. It's recommended to find a book or binder that can fit in your coat pocket for easy transport.
- **Digital** references are easy to search and update and can be shared across different devices. If going digital, ensure your device is fully charged and able to connect to the services you need.
- Regardless of the primary format of your peripheral brain, you'll likely have to use some of both paper and
 digital. Use a dedicated notebook or binder for any paper notes you need. Have digital guidelines and treatment
 algorithms bookmarked and easy to access. You can create a supplemental peripheral brain for assignments and
 projects that goes more in depth.

Organization

- Start with a table of contents. This will save you time by not having to dig through your notes.
- Choose what works best for you. Some examples of styles of organization are:
 - o By disease state, followed by related subtopics
 - o Guidelines first, followed by quick reference sheets
 - o By rotation, with quick reference sheets that carry over
- Organize your resources in a manner that allows you to quickly find information when asked

What to include

- Institution-specific policies and guidelines
- Antibiograms and antibiotic spectrum-of-activity table
- Common equations (CrCl, ABW, IBW, AdjBW, corrected calcium, etc.)
- Lab values and reference ranges
- Illness scripts
- Common drugs requiring renal/hepatic dose adjustment, CYP450 interactions, QTc prolongation, notable side effects, etc.

General tips

- Start early and update often.
 - o Make sure you have the most up-to-date guidelines in your peripheral brain.
 - o Take notes throughout the day and make updates accordingly.
- If you have to look it up, write it down.
 - o Document everything you research. This will save you time when you encounter the same topic.
 - o If a question has been answered, make a note so you don't have to ask the same question again.

Caiden Lukan Named Inaugural Recipient of the 2025 Delbert D. Konnor Award of Excellence in Pharmaceutical Administration



The Pharmacy Leadership & Education Institute (PLEI) proudly announces that Caiden Lukan, PharmD, is the inaugural recipient of the <u>Delbert D. Konnor Award of Excellence in Pharmaceutical Administration</u>. This biennial award recognizes and supports innovative research that advances the field of pharmaceutical administration.


Lukan, a 2024 graduate of Butler University (Alpha Phi Chapter), is currently pursuing a Master of Science degree in Pharmacoanalytics at the University of Pittsburgh while continuing his fellowship training. His research, which bridges pharmacy practice and health outcomes, exemplifies the purpose-driven leadership, selfless service, and lifelong learning that the Konnor Award was established to encourage.

"We are honored to recognize Dr. Lukan's outstanding proposed research that has the potential to directly inform clinical decision-making and improve patient care," said Dr. John Bentley, chair of the Konnor Award Review Committee. "His dedication to optimizing medication safety for vulnerable patient populations through data science and interdisciplinary collaboration embodies the spirit of this award."

Lukan's winning research project, titled "Evaluating Possible Adverse Drug Events in Hospitalized Patients with Renal Insufficiency", seeks to improve the detection and prevention of adverse drug events (ADE's) in patients with impaired renal function, a population at significantly higher risk for medication-related harm.

The full press release from PLEI can be found here. The Delbert D. Konnor Award provides up to \$5,000 over two years to support research and dissemination efforts, including conference presentations and peer-reviewed publications.



AAAE CAMPAIGN

As collegiate Brothers move to alumni status, they owe to this Fraternity their support and their advice. Our common bond is never severed, and our oaths and obligations persist. So long as each of us is a true Brother, we are Brothers for Life! The purposes of the <u>AAAE Campaign</u> are to increase <u>National Alumni Dues</u> paying Brothers and to help our collegiate Brothers attend <u>national meetings</u>. **Collegiate chapters will receive credit for each alumnus paying their National Alumni Dues**. **Life Member dues will count double and are included for 5 years**.

Additional registrations can be earned with 25 more dues paying alumni. New this year is an opportunity to designate your donation to any collegiate chapter. 

HISTORY CORNER

Pictured above is Rand P. Hollenback of the Xi Chapter. Brother Hollenback served as a Grand Officer in one capacity or another (e.g. Secretary, Treasurer, Editor) for 42 years. He attended no fewer than 25 consecutive Grand Councils, never missing a single one as a Brother until his death one week prior to the 46th Grand Council (1965). Rand P. Hollenback Scholarships are awarded to the top five winners of the Albert Benjamin Prescott Scholarship Award to memorialize Hollenback's years of unselfish dedication and service to the Fraternity. Hollenback lived all of his life in the community of Clintonville, a suburban neighborhood in north-central Columbus, Ohio, where he established his newspaper, The Booster, in 1933, and the city's first neighborhood council in 1942. He was affectionately known as the Mayor of Clintonville for more than 30 years.
