### John F. ("Jack") Schlegel Leadership Development Award - Call for Nominations Collegiate Brothers who conclude their final professional year of study in spring 2024 are eligible!

CALLING ALL CHAPTERS! Nominate a young leader for the Schlegel Leadership Development Award. Thanks to the generosity of Alpha Psi alumnus Jack Schlegel and his wife, Priscilla, PLEI established the Schlegel Leadership Development Award to recognize collegiate Brothers of  $\Phi\Delta X$  who demonstrate exceptional leadership potential in the pharmacy profession. The award includes a \$1,000 honorarium and is open to collegiate Brothers who are concluding their final professional year of study in spring 2024.

We encourage you to identify and nominate a deserving candidate from your chapter for this prestigious award. It is a wonderful opportunity to recognize the outstanding leadership potential of our collegiate Brothers. To be eligible for the award, the nominee must have exhibited exemplary behaviors and actions as a student and professional in training that have gained the respect of their peers.

In establishing the award, Jack noted that many student pharmacists are so focused on working their way through their educational program that they do not have time to take on formal leadership positions with organizations, but instead demonstrate their potential by exhibiting leadership in other than elected positions. He distinctly wishes all forms of leadership to be considered for this award.

Once your nominee has been identified, you should work with them to complete the nomination packet. Nomination packets should contain the application form, a personal statement (not exceeding 500 words) from the nominee including a vision of what they aspire to accomplish within 10 years after graduation, and three letters of recommendation addressing the nominee's potential for exceptional leadership in the profession after graduation. One letter of recommendation must come from the Chapter Advisor.

**The deadline for receiving nominations is May 31, 2024.** The award will be presented by the Pharmacy Leadership & Education Institute (PLEI) at the 75th Grand Council in Charleston, South Carolina on August 3, 2024. **The pathway for submitting nomination packets can be found at** <u>https://plei.org/schlegel/</u>.

### Alumni reports & Outstanding Alumni Chapter nominations due May 31

Alumni Chapters should submit <u>Alumni Foundation Program reports</u> between now and May 31. The Alumni Foundations Program is the primary tool by which Phi Delta Chi assesses Alumni Chapter activity, maintains communication, and identifies opportunities to support chapters. The AFP report is <u>required</u> of all Alumni Chapters wishing to maintain active status.

Nominations for the <u>Outstanding Alumni Chapter Award</u> are also due May 31. For Alumni Chapter convenience, nominations may be <u>submitted</u> on the same form as the AFP report. See the submission form for guidelines. The Outstanding Alumni Chapter Award will be presented at the 75th Grand Council in Charleston, SC.

#### Introduction

The Video Competition is an opportunity for your chapter to secure funding to attend Grand Council. **Grants are awarded to the 1st place (\$500), 2nd place (\$400), and 3rd place (\$300) chapters.** The winning chapters will be announced at the beginning of May, and the monetary awards will be presented to the winning chapters at or prior to Grand Council.

#### Content Theme

Once a Brother, Always a Brother

#### **Content Format**

Content can range from, but is not limited to, a video, song, photograph, painting, sculpture, comic, etc. Please make sure to capture in some way how your chapter was able to create this content.

#### **Content Style**

Chapters may determine the style of their content: serious, informative, tear-jerker, funny. We encourage any type of submission the chapter deems necessary to tell their story.

#### Video Length (if applicable)

Videos may be a maximum of 5 minutes. If a video goes over in length, it will not be reviewed.

#### **Submission**

Via GreekTrack by the Worthy Correspondent (similarly to how a monthly ChEQ form is submitted). Videos and songs will need to be submitted via a public online platform (e.g., Youtube). Artwork can be photographed and submitted via GreekTrack.

#### **Deadline**

March 31 by 11:59pm ET
