

- The ability to modify a draft email's audience. Use this in collaboration with the clone email feature to easily send similar emails to multiple audiences.
- Chapters can create conference/ticketed events. Collect registration fees, email or SMS all attendees, and more!
- Candidate Education course completion is required before transitioning Candidates to Brothers. The system will
  NOT allow the change in status until all modules are finished.
- Collegiates may only transition to alumni status **AFTER** the graduation date listed in their profile.

### Alumni Foundations Report (AFP) 2025

The Alumni Foundations Program was established in 1998 to assess Alumni Chapter activity level and to increase communication with the National Office. In accordance with Chapter VII, Number 3 of the Bylaws, Alumni chapters shall submit to the Executive Council once each year a report covering inform...

The <u>Alumni Foundations Report</u> is now open and will be due on Saturday, May 31, 2025. The <u>Alumni Foundations</u> <u>Program</u> (AFP) is the primary tool by which Phi Delta Chi assesses alumni chapter activity, maintains communication, and identifies opportunities to support chapters. This report is essential to ensure that your alumni chapter remains in good standing and remains eligible for the <u>Outstanding Alumni Chapter Award</u>. It's also a great opportunity to reflect on the amazing work your alumni chapter has been doing!

Before you begin your submission, please make sure you have the following information and documents on hand:

- Your current chapter constitution and by-laws
- The year of attendance and delegate's name for the most recent <u>Grand Council</u> where your alumni chapter was represented
- The year of attendance, Region, and delegate's name for the most recent Regional Conference where your alumni chapter was represented

Nominations for the <u>Outstanding Alumni Chapter Award</u> (optional) are also due May 31. Nominations may be submitted on the same form as the AFP report. See the submission form on GreekTrack for guidelines. The Outstanding Alumni Chapter Award will be presented at the <u>76th Grand Council in St. Charles, MO (July 30 - August 2)</u>. 

### AAAE CAMPAIGN

As collegiate Brothers move to alumni status, they owe to this Fraternity their support and their advice. Our common bond is never severed, and our oaths and obligations persist. So long as each of us is a true Brother, we are Brothers for Life! The purposes of the <u>AAAE Campaign</u> are to increase <u>National Alumni Dues</u> paying Brothers and to help our collegiate Brothers attend <u>national meetings</u>. **Collegiate chapters will receive credit for each alumnus paying their National Alumni Dues**. **Life Member dues will count double and are included for 5 years**.

For the first 15 dues-paying alumni, the collegiate chapter will receive one complimentary Grand Council registration that summer. Additional registrations can be earned with 25 more dues paying alumni. New this year is an opportunity to designate your donation to any collegiate chapter. Chapters will be notified by email when they reach these levels. Newer collegiate chapters will receive one complimentary registration for their first two national meetings. This will give the chapter time to graduate Brothers and begin the process of building their alumni base. Last year, this program allowed 18 Brothers to attend Grand Council free of registration fees, which was most appreciated by our collegiate Brothers. Let's try to top this for 2025!

The purpose of the <u>Distinguished Alumnus Award</u> is to recognize Phi Delta Chi alumni who have made significant contributions to society, and whose accomplishments, affiliations, and careers have advanced science or served humanity. The <u>Distinguished Alumnus Award</u> does more than honor its recipients. It helps illustrate the great value of Phi Delta Chi's leader-development programs, in collaboration with the Pharmacy Leadership & Education Institute (PLEI). This award program recognizes those who used their brotherhood experience as a springboard to accomplishment.

#### **Criteria for Selection**

Recipients must have demonstrated accomplishments in each of the three areas outlined below:

- 1. <u>Professional Achievement & Career</u>: The recipient attained prominence through their efforts in commerce, industry, technology, education, government, military, or other worthy endeavors that form a record of accomplishment.
- 2. <u>Service to Society</u>: The recipient exhibits a demonstrated record of accomplishment in service by bettering the lives of others through volunteer efforts.
- 3. <u>Service to Phi Delta Chi</u>: The recipient exhibits involvement within Phi Delta Chi; either on a national, regional, or local basis. The recipient upholds the principles and precepts on which Phi Delta Chi was founded and has demonstrated engagement with collegiate and/or alumni Brothers throughout their life.

### **Eligible Nominees**

- Any alumnus of Phi Delta Chi is eligible.
- Grand Officers are not eligible during their term of service.
- Alumni may be nominated posthumously within 2 years of a nominee's death.

### Nominations will be accepted using the following guidelines:

- 1. Distinguished Alumnus Nomination Form (due by May 31 of odd-numbered years)
- 2. In addition to the required Nomination Form, nominators are encouraged to provide supporting items that more fully describe the nominee and their accomplishments. Such items include, but are not limited to:
  - Letter of nomination written by the nominator (required)
  - Two letters of support from non-family members that specifically address the criteria (required)
  - Current biography or curriculum vitae (CV) for the individual
  - Newspaper and magazine articles describing accomplishments
  - Descriptions of awards or certificates of achievement
  - Other relevant item

Call for Nominations: Selfless Servant

#### **Background**

A <u>Selfless Servant</u> is the embodiment of what it means to serve the Fraternity without asking for anything in return, the humble, behind the scenes but always present Brothers. The Alumni Affairs Team established the <u>Selfless Servant</u> honor in 2017 to honor those alumni who have selflessly served the Fraternity and Brotherhood.

### **Purpose and Philosophy**

The heart of this award and main purpose is to recognize those alumni who have gone above and beyond to give back and serve the Brotherhood. It is those alumni who enthusiastically volunteer and donate their time but rarely are recognized. Those alumni who quietly, but honorably serve their chapters. Those alumni who avoid recognition.

### **Eligible Nominees**

All Phi Delta Chi alumni are eligible to be selected as a recipient of the <u>Selfless Servant</u> honor. More specifically, we will be looking for those Brothers who have never held a national or regional position but have been dedicated and active in the organization. In general, we are looking for those alumni who have been an alumni for 10 or more years.

- Alumni Brother
- Graduated at least 10 years ago
- Never held Regional or National Officer positions
- Showcased dedication to the Fraternity
- Has remained an active Brother throughout the years

### **Criteria for Selection**

- Nomination must be received by deadline: May 31 of odd-numbered years
- Nominated Brothers must meet eligibility requirements for consideration. If the nominated Brother does not meet graduation year criteria, the nominee's application will be considered when they are eligible.
- There is no maximum or minimum number of honors to be awarded each Grand Council.



Pictured above is Beta Gamma hoisting the 1992 Emory W. Thurston Grand President's Cup ("Thurston Cup"), their eighth time winning the award. The Thurston Cup has been awarded annually since 1974 and acknowledges the year's best Phi Delta Chi chapter. Beta Gamma currently has the most Thurston Cups (13), with Psi (7), Alpha Psi (5), Omega (4), Tau (3), and Alpha Phi (3) rounding out the top 5. In total, 17 chapters have earned the Thurston Cup.
