139 years ago, eleven men at the University of Michigan formed our Fraternity using the name Phi Chi.

Our founding Brothers who banded together in 1883 to form the association that grew into today's Phi Delta Chi will long be remembered by every Brother for life: Charles Edward Bond, Franklin Herbert Frazee, Llewellyn Hall Gardner, Calvin Pomeroy Godfrey, Adolph Gustave Hoffman, Arthur Gilliam Hopper, Charles F. Hueber, George Pawling Leamon, Arthur Sidney Rogers, Azor Thurston, and Albert Tenney Waggoner.

Albert Benjamin Prescott (1832-1905), then Dean of the College of Pharmacy at Michigan, encouraged the 11 founders to form our Fraternity. The founders named him our first honorary Brother and Prescott served as the group's sponsor. Dean Prescott's name is associated with the highest and finest traditions and awards of the Fraternity throughout the years.

Each year on November 2nd, we celebrate the founding of our great fraternity. Happy Founders' Day!

ALBERT B. PRESCOTT PHARMACY LEADERSHIP AWARD

Nominations due
November 4, 2022



The Albert B. Prescott Pharmacy Leadership Award, first presented in 1987, is given annually to a young pharmacist no more than 10 years after receipt of his or her PharmD. The recipient shall have demonstrated exemplary leadership qualities as a young pharmacist indicative of someone likely to emerge as a major leader in pharmacy over the course of his or her career.

The award is administered by the Pharmacy Leadership & Education Institute (PLEI) and sponsored by Phi Lambda Sigma. From its beginning, this has been a profession-wide recognition, not restricted to any fraternal group or practice setting.

The 2023 Prescott recipient, who must have received his or her PharmD in 2013 or later, will receive a \$2,000 honorarium. He or she must give an address during the 2023 American Pharmacists Association annual meeting in Phoenix, AZ (March 24-27, 2023) and prepare a text based on the address that is suitable for publication in the Journal of the American Pharmacists Association.

We invite you to nominate a young pharmacist for this award. Self-nominations are also permitted. Nominations may be submitted online via the following website: <https://plei.org/prescott/>.

Nomination materials include:

- Curriculum vitae (CV) of the nominee
- Letter of nomination
- Supporting letters of recommendation (up to 5 will be accepted)

Nomination materials must be received by November 4, 2022. Late submissions/letters will not be considered.
